#### LETTER FROM BOARD PRESIDENT

Dear Friends and Supporters,

Often when I reflect on the year that has passed, I think, "Wow, this has been a crazy year." The last few months though have re-defined "crazy year" for all of us. We hope you and your family are safe, staying positive, and finding support in your community.

COVID-19 deeply impacted Keep Cincinnati Beautiful too, forcing us to take a step back and re-think how we do business. Due to the pandemic, we lost 20% of our 2019-20 revenue, temporarily furloughed staff, and closed the office. We were able to open back up in May thanks to 100+ individuals and businesses who donated to the Emergency Relief Fund. But, we have returned to an atmosphere where the challenges have never been greater or more urgent.

Communities need our services and support now more than ever. More buildings are becoming vacant and falling into disrepair. More children need to get outside and learn about the environment. More clean, public greenspaces are needed for people to gather safely.



# ARTS

Our Arts Program uses art as a catalyst for change; reducing blight, crime, and illegal graffiti in some of the most forgotten parts of our city. Community eyesores, like vacant buildings, tagged retaining walls, and rusty chain-link fences are transformed into community assets by creating simple, low-cost works of art. The facades of boarded buildings are painted with Trompe l'oeil representations of doors and windows, heavily vandalized walls are given new life with simple geometric murals, and commonly discarded materials are transformed into eco-art installations. Our work is changing the appearance and perception of neighborhoods, improving the quality of life and encouraging economic development.

#### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Our Arts team accomplished a number of new and innovative projects this year. We completed our *Cincinnati is Beautiful* mini-mural series and distributed over 30 interactive chalkboard murals to neighborhoods all across the city. The *Cincinnati is Beautiful* mural was recognized in City Beat's Best of the City. To top it all off, we were selected to participate in BLINK as light installation artists, muralists, and parade performers. A big shout out to the over 750 volunteers that worked on Cincinnati's first fully crowd-sourced mural. Next time you are down by Findlay Market (1909 Race Street) come and take your own selfie with the *Make Your Mark* mural.

# EDUCATION ENTAL

Our Environmental Education Program connects economically disadvantaged children with the environment to help them grow social and emotional skills, learn about the world around them, and take action to make a positive difference. We bring nature into the classroom and classrooms outside into nature. Our free programming is offered to any school in the Greater Cincinnati area and includes: assemblies, classroom presentations, cleanups, service learning, field trips, and a local environmental issues project. Often our free programs are the only nature-based learning a student participates in because their schools have limited resources.





#### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Participating in a cleanup or learning how to recycle are simple ways children can take direct action and grow stewardship for their community. This year we hosted programs in over 75 classrooms. Aligning our programs to Ohio's learning standards and blocking our programs to specific grade bands means that as students *grow*, our programs *grow* with them, giving them a variety of more well rounded experiences. Providing students with a consistent environmental message reinforces environmental literacy and inspires a lifelong appreciation for the environment. Today's students are tomorrow's future; the green habits learned from our Environmental Education Program are leading to a more engaged and connected Cincinnati.



# BB III BB III ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES

Our Environmental Services Program combats illegal activities that threaten green, clean, and beautiful places in Cincinnati's neighborhoods through illegal dumping remediation and graffiti abatement. This deters acts of environmental crime and vandalism through strategic community partnerships and strong working relationships with local government agencies.

#### **PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS**

Our Environmental Services Program identified, monitored, and remediated 100+ illegal dumpsites this year. Surveillance cameras provided the identity of 80 environmental crime offenders to local law enforcement, which will help prevent future illegal dumping from occurring. Hamilton County's Environmental Crimes Sheriff received the Law Enforcement Award from Keep Ohio Beautiful in recognition of his fortitude and dedication to the Environmental Services Program. Lastly, we aided the City of Cincinnati Department of Public Services in identifying illegal dumping "hot spots" for the installation of 50 new illegal dumping signs.





# GREENSPACE

Our Greenspace Program creates green, clean, and beautiful places in Cincinnati's neighborhoods through two signature initiatives: Spaces-to-Places (formerly Vacant Lots: Occupied) and Help-A-Lot. The goal of both programs is to encourage people to restore underutilized public spaces into socially, culturally, and environmentally responsible spaces that reflect the character of the neighborhood.





#### **PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS**

Hundreds of dedicated volunteers worked with the Greenspace Program by planting trees and garden beds, and by maintaining existing landscapes in underserved public spaces. In Evanston, the Spaces-to-Places project continues to be nurtured through the establishment of the pocket park, orchard, and pollinator prairie. In Camp Washington, students, professionals, and community members are planning a Spaces-to-Places project focused on increasing the neighborhood's tree canopy. The new greenspaces enhance both wildlife and the community by providing improved air quality, reduced stormwater runoff, moderated temperatures, and decreased stress - all of which are beneficial for the environment and health.

# VOLUNTEER PROGRAMS

Our Volunteer Programs have empowered people to better their community through beautification, litter prevention, and improving public spaces for over 20 years.
